RESOLUTION 2016-06 RESOLUTION TO ENSURE THE CIVIL RIGHTS OF ALL ALCONA COUNTY STUDENTS

WHEREAS, the Obama Administration, the U.S. Department of Justice and the U.S. Department of Education have no right to supersede Constitutional Parental and Guardian Rights;

WHEREAS, the Obama Administration, the U.S. Department of Justice and the U.S. Department of Education have no authority to legislate over parental/guardian rights to allow students to choose their gender, name, pronoun and bathroom/locker rooms, etc.;

WHEREAS, this student choice would expose young people who are not transgender to sexual predators, assault and/or battery (bullying), etc.;

WHEREAS, the "Dear Colleague Letter on Transgender Students" dated May 16, 2016, was distributed to schools across the country by mandate of the Obama Administration, uses Title 1X to threaten schools to comply with the guidelines or to lose Federal funding.

WHEREAS, the "Dear Colleague Letter on Transgender Students" further states that schools can provide "additional privacy options" that can be incorporated in the policies and practices of each school;

WHEREAS, a local school's use of "additional privacy options" shall be viewed as compliance with the "Dear Colleague Letter on Transgender Students";

WHEREAS, we must reaffirm that all students shall enjoy a safe and discrimination-free environment without the threat of losing Federal funding and that each Board of Education develop policies that conform to Title IX requirements without exposing the majority of students to an unsafe environment;

WHEREAS, we must reaffirm that, with the adoption of this Resolution, the Alcona County Board of Commissioners does not intend to discriminate against anyone protected by the Constitution of the United States of America, the State of Michigan, or any applicable laws;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Alcona County Board of Commissioners requests that Governor Rick Snyder, the United States Senators of Michigan, the United States Representatives of Michigan, the Michigan House Representatives; the Michigan Senate Representatives; Michigan Attorney General Bill Schuette; the Michigan State Board of Education; the Michigan Department of Education protect the civil liberties of all citizens of Alcona County and to stand firm against the Federal Government's edict that transgender people must be allowed to use public bathrooms that conform to their gender identity.

911 Operating Surcharge Renewal

For the period beginning on July 1, 2017, and continuing through the month of June, in the year 2021 shall Alcona County be authorized to assess a monthly surcharge of up to \$3.00 (not to exceed \$3.00) on the monthly billings of landline, wireless and VOIP service suppliers within the geographic boundaries of Alcona County to exclusively finance the equipment and operating costs of the 911 Emergency Telephone Answering and Dispatch System within Alcona County? This is a renewal of a previously voter approved authorization that will expire before the effective date of this authorization.

Millage Proposal 2016

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes that may be assessed against all property in Alcona County be increased, as provided for in Article 9, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution, and the Alcona County Board of Commissioners be authorized to levy a new millage not to exceed 0.15 mill (\$0.15 per thousand dollars) of taxable value of such property for a period of four (4) years beginning with the levy to be made on December 1, 2016, estimated to generate \$110,395.00 in the first year, disbursed to Alcona County for the purpose of enhancing law enforcement efforts in county wide drug interdiction, funding the drug interdiction program known as the Huron Undercover Narcotics Team and preserving and protecting the safety of the citizens of Alcona County?
