

Revocation of DNR Orders

Declarant or advocate may revoke, at any time and in any manner he/she may communicate intent. Upon revocation, the declarant, advocate, attending physician (or designee) shall destroy the order and remove the I.D. bracelet. Revocation is included as part of permanent medical record.

DNR I.D. Bracelets

Bracelets **must** be imprinted with the words:

- "Do-Not-Resuscitate Order"
- Name and address of declarant
- Name and phone number of declarant's attending physician

Note: Type size and style must be easily read.

Roles/Responsibilities EMS Personnel

If the patient has a pulse or spontaneous respiration, EMS must treat. EMS personnel must establish the following in order to withhold treatment: 1) patient is 18 years of age or older, 2) has NO vital signs (pulse or respiration), and 3) patient is wearing a valid DNR I.D. bracelet or is provided a copy of a valid DNR order.

PUBLIC ACT 193

Known as the
"Michigan Do-Not-Resuscitate Act"

"An act to provide for the execution of a DNR order for a patient in a setting outside of a hospital, nursing home, or a mental health facility, owned or operated by the department of community health . . ."
